Overview

Established in the Fall of 2000, the EDU, Inc. Common Black College Application (CBCA) has become one of the most recognized educational services in the country. To date, over **250,000** students have completed the CBCA to apply to our Member Institutions. Students are currently able to apply to **59** Member Institutions at the same time. The completion of the CBCA increases the educational options of students by allowing them to receive acceptance letters, financial packages and scholarship offers from several different colleges. Our School District partnerships can play a critical role in helping to establish a college going culture.

Completing the CBCA

- Students go to www.commonblackcollegeapp.com and click on APPLY NOW to create an account and submit their application.
- The School District will be provided with a Promo Code that will waive the **\$20** application fee.
- When completing the CBCA, students will be asked to enter their school CEEB code, the name and email address of their School Counselor. (This information will be used to allow the School Counselor to create an account and upload official student transcripts.)
- Although students are asked to select their top four college choices, their application is made available to all Member Institutions.
- This Fall, we will launch the Practice Common Black College Application for 9th and 10th grade students. The objective is to help students become familiar with the college application process at an early age.

Student Dashboard

- Go to www.commonblackcollegeapp.com and click on Log In. Enter email address and password used to complete the CBCA.
- Students can upload their SAT and ACT scores and track the progress of their application.
- Students can communicate with our Member Institutions using the Direct Messaging Feature.

School Counselor Dashboard

- Go to www.commonblackcollegeapp.com and click on High School Counselor to register for an account.
- School Counselors can upload official student transcripts.
- All Member Institutions can access the CBCA, test scores and official transcripts for every student.

2017-2018 CBCA Completion Data

- 13,980 students completed the CBCA.
- 93% of the students were accepted to at least one CBCA Member Institution.
- 73% of students indicated they will attend CBCA Member Institution.
- 53% of students indicated they received some type of scholarship.
- 32% of students indicated they received a full scholarship.
